1. COMBATING CRIME

Over recent months there has been a spike in ASB on East St. This unacceptable behaviour has been trader focused and seem to be the same group of individuals.

On the back of Bristol City Council suggestions, police rep meetings and local Cllr support we shall be taking the following actions:

1. A joint complaint to say the police support we are getting isn't effective enough with the hope that our ongoing *report, report, report* process encourages more resources to be committed to East St.

2. A community trigger, which starts a review process across the different departments/services to see what is needed to address our issues. You can find out more information via link:

3. Making a case to request designated community officers in our area. Although they do not hold the same policing power they can be called upon as expert witnesses when/if a case goes through to prosecution.

Olivia Nava, Bubble Cafe, is the BBID lead on tackling crime and is in contact with our police reps on behalf of us.

She runs our DISC system, which has been prioritised on East St and now being piloted on the wider scheme hospitably venues.

DISC allows the police and other members to see realtime reports and becomes a database for ABS, to be evaluated and utilised.
